Community Organizer

As a community organizer, you are passionate about the needs of your community and helping others. You run a grassroots organization that focuses on reducing the impacts of climate change to your community. Anyone can be a community organizer, but a degree in social work can give you a leg up in this field.

Special Skill:

CAREER CARD

Meteorologist

When planning a prescribed burn, it's important to stay informed of the weather conditions. You communicate with wildland firefighters about wind, precipitation, and temperature conditions. You'll need a bachelor's degree in atmospheric sciences and strong communication skills to be a meteorologist.

Special Skill:

Forecast the fire weather. When it's your turn, you can peek at the next Hazard Card. Decide if you want to draw it, or put it back at the bottom of the draw pile.



CAREER CARD

Forest Manager

You are the district forest manager for the local national forest. Your job is to implement management plans that focus on improving ecosystem health and reducing wildfire risk. A forest manager typically has a degree in forestry or biology.

Special Skill:

Prevent fire risks in the community forest. Don't add any hazards to the community forest.



CAREER CARD

Wildland Firefighter

There are many types of wildland firefighters. You are a prescribed fire manager, responsible for implementing prescribed burns with your crew of firefighters. To be a firefighter, you will need to pass rigorous physical fitness tests and be certified. Many agencies also require college experience in a variety of fields.

Special Skill:

For every hazard piece you remove from the community forest, you get to remove an extra one.
